All My Lies Are True Reading Group Questions

These questions may help get a reading group discussion on All My Lies Are True, started.

Warning: contains possible spoilers!

1. What goes through your mind when you find out who Serena's daughter, Verity, is dating?
2. How shocked do you think Serena and Poppy were when they were brought back together and the reasons why they are in each other's lives again?
3. Was Serena unnecessarily harsh on Verity when the police arrived to search their house? Why?
4. Why do you think Poppy tolerates being treated so badly by her parents for so long?
5. When Verity was first arrested, were you surprised at how much her mother's as an Ice Cream was going to influence how she was treated?
6. When you were given both accounts of the months leading up to Verity's boyfriend being hurt, who did you instinctively believe – Verity or her partner? Why? How did you feel when you found out the truth?
7. Serena hears from Poppy what life was like in prison and it scares her. What were you thinking at this point of the novel? Did you have any theories as to what might happen?
8. Both Poppy and Serena are at breaking point towards the end of the novel. How has the author showed us the journey to the point where they're both about to fall apart?
9. At the end of the book, Verity isn't where she thought she would be at the beginning of the novel. Do you think the legacy of the Ice Cream Girls is really over, or will it continue with her?
