I Know What You've Done Reading Group Questions

These questions may help get a reading group discussion on I Know What You've Done, started.

Warning: contains possible spoilers!

1. What would you do in Rae's position of having a book with all your neighbours secrets? Would you have read the book or handed it in straight to the police? Why?
2. Which character did you like the most? Why?
3. Which character did you like the least? Why?
4. Despite setting the story during 2021 and making oblique references to it, the author deliberately avoids directly mentioning the Pandemic. Why do you think she chose to do this?
5. At one point, Priscilla tells Bryony she is a terrible mother. Given Bryony's dire situation and limited means of escape, do you think Priscilla was unnecessarily harsh on her?
6. Lily has an unhealthy obsession with one of her neighbours. Do you think she's genuinely in love or she is using her infatuation to hide from the larger issues of her life?
7. During the novel, Rae becomes attracted to one of her neighbours. Do you think it as because of what she thinks her husband, Clark, is doing or do you think the attraction would have developed anyway?
8. Considering the lies, betrayal and deceit in the novel, which of the characters did you empathise with the most? Why?
9. Which 'reveal' was the biggest and most shocking for you? Why?
